As a result of the carryback, Taxpayer reduced their regular tax liability on Form 990-T, Part III, Line 35c to \$0 and increased their alternative minimum tax on Line 38 by \$3,525,378 to \$4,703,137.

Form 8821, Line 1 AMT for 2014 is reported at \$4,557,744 and not \$4,703,137 as calculated on the 2014 Form 4626. The difference represents a corrected overstated in a period where the status of limitations on assessment had expired. Taxpayer seeks a credit for prior year minimum tax only on the amount of AMT paid in 2014.
